site stake. One pair of partners compete as a unit against the other. They alternate pitch for fairness, walk to the opposite end, call the score, and pitch back until each team has thrown 48 count-all shoes.



President's Report

I hope everyone is ready for the outdoor season to ramp up. I always find my excitement ramps up as everything turns green.

I am happy to announce that Michele Burns has volunteered to step back into the Sec.\Treas. position for the MHPA. We are very glad to have her in the role and she is ready to make sure things are in order.

We made things official at the Spring meeting on April 20th, 2024. Be sure to tell her "Thank You!"

A new grievance form is available for members on the Website. Look for the "Contact Us" button that currently just displays the form. You will be able to electronically submit the grievance and it will be sent to our 2nd Vice President Zach Spanke to begin the review process.

We discussed several topics at the meeting and we heard a couple of suggestions that came from our membership.

One in particular we discussed was inquiring about the possibility of a "online-pay\registration" option when it came to the State Tournament. We are awaiting some details from our bank. We will explore other avenues as well. We will share information as we have it.

Another was in regards to pitchers sometimes needing to stay at a tournament all day when they will only pitch in the morning or afternoon. Specifically, when it came to indoor tournaments.

We currently run two shifts (when the number of participants allow) and score keepers are needed for each shift. This can keep some pitchers at the site all day. (For example, they pitch or keep score in the morning and pitch or keep score in the afternoon)

The request was to consider scheduling the shifts at a certain time so that pitchers knew when they could arrive instead of requiring everyone at the site by 9:30 a.m. (Example Shift 1 at 10 a.m. and Shift 2 at 1:30 p.m.)

We have some thoughts about this and will share some of it with the person who inquired. We will see if they follow up with us.

I want to get everyone thinking about the Fall meeting at the State Tournament (In Kalamazoo). The position of President and 2nd Vice President are up for election. If you or anyone or know would make a good officer or want to step into them now would be the time to start considering it.

Constitution Changes Starting 1/1/2024

Rule change regarding the pitchers with ringer percentages under 25%, 30 points or 40 shoes, whichever comes first. That is probably the biggest change and we (as an association) will need to make sure we start off on the right foot with enforcing and staying consistent with it. I know as we have more tournaments it will become old hat. However, old habits die hard too. — Josh Lull, MHPA President



NHPA National Horseshoe Pitchers Association "Come Pitch with Us!"

Many reasons the NHPA-WT has a poor turn-out this year; Distance is too far from where most horse-shoe pitchers reside, which is in the midwest; Driving, flying and housing keep going up because of gouging: And, confusion this year of the change in who pitches when.

Lack of Publicity: Horseshoe Pitching despite being one of the common sports in the USA doesn't have a channel dedicated to it nor does it get occasional exposure on major TV channels or sports magazines.

NHPA rule changes now and yet to come?

- There has been questions and talk about the "pacer" rule the NHPA passed at last years convention. The spirit of the rule is to allow clubs the ability to let non-sanction pitchers pace in leagues and tournaments. It is a way to recruit pitchers and allow them to try our sport before committing to a sanctioned membership.
- Another rule was allowing women over 65 to pitch up to the 20' line. NHPA Standing Rule for Senior Women 65+ October 2023 to July 2024: May pitch from any place on the extended or full-distance platform and shall observe the Twenty-foot (20') foul line.

This will be voted on at the 2024 Convention as to the experimental results that we obtain prior to that date. We are working on tracking the results of this experiment on e-shoe. In Ohio, we are already tracking all such people to get credible data.

• Still another rule was allowing people from one State to play in the State Tournament of another state under certain difficult circumstances.

Difficult circumstances could be driving a long distance in your state when you live and pitch in a neighboring State. Also, people who live in more than one State may choose which state they want to pitch in. The Council has decided that a pitcher should submit evidence as to why they want to pitch in a neighboring State. This rule was not implemented to allow people to switch to another State just because they have a problem with their home State. -NHPA

Just a reminder of some of the ways to bring someone into play who isn't sure.

Free Trial member - can play in a summer league for free or one tournament. Pitching stats will not be loaded into eshoe. They will not be eligible for any awards from the league or state. Would have to pay full membership the following year.

\$10 Provisional Member - Can play league and play as many tournaments but not allowed to play in any state event. Pitching stats will be uploaded to eshoe. Might be eligible for club awards but not state. May enter state events only by paying the difference on the full membership (\$45).

Constitution and By-laws Changes

The Constitution and By-laws may be revised by submitting changes at any membership meeting or sending to the chairperson of the Constitution and By-laws Committee, 1st Vice-President Tina Payne, by July 15th.

All proposed revisions are voted on at the State Tournament meeting. Any additions, deletions and/or changes takes a two-thirds vote of members present at the meeting and become effective January 1st of the following year.

Hall of Fame nomination forms must be received by June 15th for the nominee to be included in the voting for that year. Send HOF form to Danny Markley.

Mechanics of a Pitch

- 1. **Grip:** (3/4, 1-1/4, 1-3/4, Flip)
- 2. **Assume a Stance:** Placement of feet, side by side, left foot in front, or in back of right, allowing for one step, and enough room so foul line won't be stepped on.
- 3. **Address the Stake:** Preparing to pitch, getting comfortable and balanced, staring at the stake, taking a deep breath, taking aim, blocking out distractions, concentration.
- 4. **Back Swing:** The back swing of your arm, the height of the back swing is usually when your arm is parallel to the ground or comfortably behind you.
- 5. **The Step:** Weight distributed so you are comfortable. The step begins when the back swing is complete and allows enough leverage to lift the shoe to the target.
- 6. **Front Swing:** The front swing of your arm, the height of the front swing is usually shoulder high in front of you in line with the stake.
- 7. **Release and Lift:** At the height of the front swing, shoulder high, letting the shoe slip out of your grip.
- 8. **Follow Through:** The nice easy motion of allowing your body to stay in place as you watch your shoe go on for a ringer, the front swing should continue straight up after releasing the shoe with a bend in the elbow.

Pitching a Horseshoe, What you want to accomplish...

Open Shoe: An open shoe landing. **Distance:** The same distance constantly.

Alignment: Making sure of hitting the stake. (*the most difficult*) **Rhythm Pitch:** Using the same motion to deliver.

From MHPA Hall of Fame members

Bob Hitt, Plymouth, 1967: The winners prizes in the '30's were ridiculously small. When Hitt won his three state championships, his share of the prize money was a mere \$40 per tournament. When he was in a fairgrounds exhibition, he rarely made over \$15. After he had won his first state title, young Bobbie told a reporter: "With the \$40 I got, I bought a suit of clothes, my school supplies and took in a ball game,"



History gets made in Jackson!

On February 17, 2024, a first happened in Michigan Horseshoe Pitching Association history. Four women threw over 60% in the same tournament, and in the same class indoors at Jackson. Denise Daly threw 71.95% for first in A, with Brandy Morehead tossing 72.22%, Helga Hewlett pitching 61.73%, and Lisa Smith pitched 60.63%. There were only two instances in a cursory look through old tournaments where there were three over 60%. The first was the State Tournament in 1996, where Kathy Yaworski (68.1%), Anne French (67.4%), and Judy Curtiss (64.7%) topped 60% (Dorothy Falk came close to 60% with

58.1%). The second was at the State Tournament in 2010, where Judy Curtiss (78.1%), Judy Dennis (62.8%), and Terry Beagle (60.8%) topped 60% (these 3 and Sheryll Card all were over 60% in NatStats in the late 2000s, but never did all more than three hit over 60% in the same tournament.)

Plenty of changes have happened through the years. At one point, a woman pitching 50% was a rare event through the 60s into the 70s. Men would have to be pitching 60% just to hope to get into Class A during that same time, and Elders at 30 foot were nonexistent.

Comparing the standards of the top 100 Men pitchers in the NHPA, it took 68.8% in 1979 to be there, in 1985 the top 27 were over 70%, and it now takes only 50.9% to reach the top 100 in 2024. Let's look at the names on the 1979 list from Michigan:

Roy Smith 76.0% (27), Floyd Bartley 72.1% (57), Gerald Maison 70.0% (81), Mark Freeman 68.8% (99). Sandy Wohlgemuth was in the top 20 Women in 1979 with 60.2% (20). There was no Elder list back then.

On April 4, 2024, the tops in each class were pulled for this report. **Here are the Top 100 Men from Michigan:**

Andrew Adams 73.13% (7) James Dunlap 62.50% (28) Eric Soltis 56.89% (55) Quincy Johnson 53.46% (83) Keith Schafer 51.61% (93)



The Top 100 Women from Michigan are:

Denise Daly 72.46% (14) Brandy Morehead 66.02% (22) Lisa Smith 62.02% (32) Helga Hewlett 58.50% (49) Terry Beagle 57.12% (52) Pam Yates 48.90% (100)

J D Drake 68.17% (27) Clip Connin 61.67 (85)

In the Top 50 boys are:

Kayden Fowler 56.47% (3) Jayden Fri 36.61% (18) Brent Castle 27.26% (38)

Jackson VanCleave 21.64% (14) is in the Top 25 Cadets.

The research into results before 1992 continues, and any help for the "district" tournament results for this time-period will be appreciated. Contact me with your finds (I have been through the News Digests and other national stuff the NHPA has, and I need anything else that can be found to fill in the gaps.) Thanks for anything we can put together to create a full record. The tournament schedules for 1969, 1971, 1983, 1988, and 1989 are also incomplete. We now have almost 50,000 lines of individual pitcher's data since January 1992 (thanks to Paula Summerlin and her successors as statistician), nearly 8,000 lines of incomplete results prior to 1992, and some 1970s Upper Peninsula data which is also incomplete. I will hand everything over to Josh Lull this fall for him to add to our Hall of Fame computer for the membership to access and to update in the future.


father of 5 children and eight grandchildren.

An Open Letter to Tournament, League Directors and Women

We all agree that we need to do something to keep or increase our membership. I have checked some past minutes of membership and board meetings and found that in 2018 we had 622 members of the MGSHPA and in 2023 that number had dropped to 313, a loss of 309 members. That is a huge loss in membership.

We need to all do what we can to keep the members we have while promoting our sport to recruit new members.

One way we can do this is to embrace the new NHPA Standing Rule for Senior Women in our leagues, local and state tournaments. Sr. Women like Sr. Men or Elders lose muscle mass and strength as they age, and this new standing rule is a long time coming. I know that many people disagree with this, but many sports have changed rules/guidelines over the years to have increased participation and interest, and Horseshoes should be NO different. Just because a senior woman has lost muscle mass or strength, doesn't mean that she is ready to be relegated to the sidelines. These women have often been members for 20, 30, 40 plus years, still have the drive to compete and to the desire to stay active. Sr. Women deserve to

be given the same consideration as Elders.

Standing Rule for Senior Women at 65 years old

Senior Women turning sixty-five (65) during the calendar year may pitch from any place on the extended or full-distance platform and shall observe the Twenty foot (20') foul line.


What this means is that Sr. Women can stand anywhere from the 30' line up and not go beyond the 20' line. Most women will likely move up a couple of steps, but the NHPA didn't want to add another foul line to the pitching platform, so they came up the compromise to observe the 20' foul line.

My ask is two-fold: 1) that every league, every local open-tournament include this division and that we embrace this group of Horseshoe pitchers as we would cadets and elders, and 2) to any Woman who will be turning 65 in 2024 or who are older, enter your league and tournaments as a Sr. Woman.

We all know that we play against opponents in tournaments based on our averages, not the age of our opponent or from where they stand on the pitching platform. Minnesota needs to be the leader in embracing the Sr. Women division including at our State Tournament.

Sr. Women are vital to our sport.

Other forgotten cities that held in state tournament are: Detroit, Iron River, Dimondale, Burr Oak, Weston, and Lake Orion, (not forgotten).

It is always an honor to put on a uniform representing the sport you love. Wear a horseshoe shirt to all events; it is the uniform of our sport. The shirt will feel beyond great and look good on you, too. Top it off with your favorite horseshoe pitching cap.

Also, wear a horseshoe pitching shirt so members will know you by name. As part of new membership, give new members a club shirt so if they want to join in on sanctioned tournaments, they will already be prepared. Keep bugging them about pitching in your scheduled sanctioned tournaments. The first one can be without joining the NHPA.

It has always amazed me that most of us have more than one tournamaent shirt or some other horsehoe pitching shirt in our closets. How can you not wear one when you are at a horsehoe event?
