Meet the Rules Committee

Because of the unexpected challenges encountered by the NHPA Council in recent months, I offered to help 1st VP Austin Bailey conduct the business of the rules committee. We just finished up this year's business and I thought it would be appropriate to publish a short intro into the committee and what we do. There are currently 6 committee members besides Austin for a total of 7.

Dan Sanders – OH, Deb Michaud – MA, Tina Hawkins – OK, Russ Girtz – MN, Clarence Lassiter – SC, Jerry LaBrosse – MN.

There is an estimated 329 years of combined horseshoe involvement and experience in every aspect of the game represented by this group. It is an honor working closely with these dedicated folks for the good of our sport.

The rules committee acts as the filter for all proposals for rules changes (PRC's) and bylaw changes (PBC's). Each proposal is carefully evaluated and researched as needed. Some proposals need several rounds of email discussion which is very time consuming. The proposals are eventually voted on and either pass or fail, based on committee criteria. The committee members must decide on what is best for the organization and the game rather than their own personal opinions.

When submitting changes, note the proper format, which is:

- 1. State the current Rule to be changed.
- 2. State the proposed Rule as changed.
- 3. State the reasoning.

The committee strives to advance proposals that make sense and improve in some meaningful way. Here is a quote borrowed from a friend

"Change for change sake deserves no double take Change to improve our sport, deserves our full support."

PBC 1

Article VII: Charters

SECTION 6

Current wording:

A charter will be entitled to convention delegates based upon the previous year's total membership as follows:

Further expansion of the above will continue in increments of 1 per 100 members.

Proposed wording:

A charter will be entitled to one delegate for being an active charter with the NHPA. Additional convention delegates based upon the previous year's total membership as follows:

Further expansion of the above will continue in increments of 49 and at the 50th member increment will include one additional delegate.

<u>Rationale</u>

EXAMPLE: Charter A has 37 members and Charter B has 251 members. Charter A receives one delegate for being active and o for membership totaling 1 delegate. Charter B receives one delegate for being active and 5 for membership totaling 6 delegates.

Note: Once the NHPA membership reaches 15,000 members the original-style delegation of increments of 1 delegate per 100th member.

Rationale: Until we see drastic change charters will lose delegation quick and not have as much pull in the delegation process. 100 members is hard to gain as of now, and 50 is more attainable. This gives charters more incentive to achieve more numbers as the more we get the better we will grow. Once the NHPA members climb back to 15,000 and we are more operable again this should be changed back to the original style. This is needed for our charters to find a voice. From the 2022 membership totals on the 2023 delegate packet we had 97 delegates, the new style would add 72 delegates for 169 total. This makes voting more powerful too. Making the votes weigh more than current at less than 100. It allows for someone who knows someone not to try to conquer votes easier, it makes an election or a bid... an election or a bid, not a shoo-in (no pun intended.) In all seriousness, this will make a positive change in making it more attractive to charters to gain members. For 2022, this would have 9 charters at one vote instead of 29 at one vote. A 31% decrease in one vote charters. It gives the power back to the delegates. See chart...

PBC 2

ARTICLE V, SECTION 7

Current wording:

Candidates for NHPA office must announce their candidacy in writing to be received by the current NHPA President and the NHPA Newsline Editor no later than April 1st. Incumbents, however, must announce their candidacy in the same manner by February 1st

Proposed wording:

Candidates for NHPA office must announce their candidacy in writing to be received by the current NHPA President and the NHPA Newsline Editor no later than April 1st. Incumbents, however, must announce their candidacy in the same manner by February 1st. Note: There will be no nominations accepted from the floor of the convention if there are any established candidates who have properly submitted their candidacy prior to the specified deadlines.

Rationale:

The Rules and Bylaws of the NHPA have served us for about 100 yrs. For many decades, we have not accepted nominations from the floor if there was an established candidate. We have been using the nomination process outlined in Section 7 because that's the way our predecessors wanted it. I researched nomination procedures under Robert's Rules of Order and Here is the first sentence of Chapter 12

Chapter 12 - Nominations and Elections

"In every organization, the process of nominating and electing officers and board members is very important, and the bylaws should clearly state the procedure."

Our Bylaws clearly state the process we've used for many decades and I do not believe we are violating any of Robert's Rules. We may not use a common process, but it's not improper.

This added sentence is needed to remove any confusion.

Proposed Bylaws/Rules Changes to be reviewed at the World Tournament

PBC 3

ARTICLE IX, SECTION 11

Current wording:

The Executive Council shall award, by a 2/3 vote, the privilege of hosting a World Tournament, at least two years in advance.

Proposed wording:

The Convention shall award, by a majority vote, the privilege of hosting a World Tournament, two years in advance. Absentee voting for the World Tournament site shall be allowed for any Charters unable to send delegates to the NHPA Convention. That voting shall be confidential, and the absentee ballots will be opened only after the voting on the floor of the Convention is completed. Absentee ballots for this World Tournament site vote must be received by the NHPA president on or before the Friday prior to the Convention. if three or more sites are bidding and none receives a majority vote the two sites receiving the most votes will have a runoff on a second ballot. In the event, no World Tournament bid is received by the NHPA deadline, the Executive Council has the authority to award the Tournament site, but only for that next open year.

Reasoning:

Let's put the power back into the hands of the delegation. We are losing the clout needed to make changes for the success of the NHPA. By allowing bidders to come back and present adds more hospitality and more edge to the voting process. We shouldn't have the hands of 7 people voting where our WT should be held. The current demographics of the NHPA Executive Council are all together except for one outlier. This is contradictory of why we gave them the power in the first place. To pick a perfect site for us all. The delegates lost a personal and powerful stance when it was given to the council. We must take back control of our voting rights and plan a future for the NHPA that is paved by the members, for the members.



Proposed Bylaws/Rules Changes to be reviewed at the World Tournament

PBC 4

ARTICLE XI, SECTION 3

Current wording:

Bylaws and Rule changes due to NHPA 1st Vice President by September 30th for consideration by rules committee. If a revision is authorized, there shall be no other amendments proposed to the existing Bylaws.

Proposed wording:

Bylaws and Rule changes are due to the NHPA 1st Vice President by February 1st of the voting year, for consideration by the rules committee. If a revision is authorized, there shall be no other amendments proposed to this existing Bylaw.

Additional note: If this PBC passes, then Standing Rule #11 will need to be updated to reflect the new date, or simply removed by majority vote of the NHPA Council.

Rationale:

There is no need to have the deadline for rules changes less than two months after the annual delegate meeting. The delegates just voted on rules and there is no time for things to go in effect with the current January 1st rule. Hoping that passes, this will help the committee receive more quality of rules and bylaws changes. This gives the R&B committee 3-4 months to discuss these items and consider merit. If PBC allowing immediate change passes this will give ample time to see how the adjustment was made and for the committee to reconvene and see if that change back or a new change is needed.



Proposed Bylaws/Rules Changes to be reviewed at the World Tournament

PRC #1

Current Wording:

Section B - Cadets(See REQUIREMENT 6, for exceptions and additional information)

1.Cadet Boys (any male pitcher twelve (12) years old or younger for the entire calendar year) Cadet Boys may pitch from any place on the extended or full-distance platforms. They shall observe the twenty foot (20') foul lines. Note: Cadet Boys may choose to move into the Junior Boys Division prior to the age guidelines, but cannot return to the Cadet Boys, once this declaration has been made.

1.Cadet Girls (any female pitcher twelve (12) years old or younger for the entire calendar year) Cadet Girls may pitch from any place on the extended or full-distance platforms. They shall observe the twenty foot (20') foul lines. Note: Cadet Girls may choose to move into the Junior Girls Division prior to the age guidelines, but cannot return to the Cadet Girls, once this declaration has been made.

Proposed Wording:

Section B - Cadets(See REQUIREMENT 6, for exceptions and additional information)

1.Cadet Boys (any male pitcher ten (10) years old or younger for the entire calendar year) Cadet Boys may pitch from any place on the extended or full-distance platforms. They shall observe the twenty foot (20') foul lines. Note: Cadet Boys may choose to move into the Junior Boys Division prior to the age guidelines, but cannot return to the Cadet Boys, once this declaration has been made.

1.Cadet Girls (any female pitcher ten (10) years old or younger for the entire calendar year) Cadet Girls may pitch from any place on the extended or full-distance platforms. They shall observe the twenty foot (20') foul lines. Note: Cadet Girls may choose to move into the Junior Girls Division prior to the age guidelines, but cannot return to the Cadet Girls, once this declaration has been made.

REASON - this aligns with all sports in school systems. Elementary School is kindergarten through 5th grade (ages 5-10), middle school is grades 6-8 (ages 11-13), and high school is grades 9-12 (ages 14-18). Middle school sports closely resemble high school and in some instances middle school will combine with high school. After 10 is also the average age of when kids will go through puberty getting taller and stronger allowing them to throw from a greater distance.



Proposed Bylaws/Rules Changes to be reviewed at the World Tournament

PRC 2

Rule 1 Current Wording

Section F - Elder Men (become eligible to pitch in the Elders Division upon purchase of an NHPA card dated for the calendar year that they become sixty-five (65) years old).

- 1. Elder Men may pitch from any place on either the extended or full-distance platforms, and shall observe the twentyseven-foot (27') foul line. Elder Men must notify their Charter Membership Director, in advance, of the date that they intend to begin pitching from this shorter distance. Once a member declares himself a short-distance pitcher, he must remain in that Division until the next year's membership card is purchased. At that time he may switch back to the Open Men's division, but must remain in that division until the next year's membership card is purchased.
 Note: See Rule 11, Section D.1 for additional information about re-qualifying.
- 2. Physically Challenged Men Physically challenged, Male pitchers less than sixty-five (65) years old may be given permission, by their governing Charter, to move onto the extended platforms in the Elders Division and observe the twenty-seven-foot (27') foul lines. The prior completion and approval of a Medical Exemption Application form (available from Charter Secretaries and on some Charter Websites) is required. At the World Tournament and at State Championship Tournaments, they shall compete in the Elders Division

Proposed Wording

Section F - Elders (become eligible to pitch in the Elders Division upon purchase of an NHPA card dated for the calendar year that they become sixty-five (65) years old).

- 1. Elder Men may pitch from any place on either the extended or full-distance platforms, and shall observe the twentyseven-foot (27') foul line. Elder Men must notify their Charter Membership Director, in advance, of the date that they intend to begin pitching from this shorter distance. Once a member declares himself a short-distance pitcher, he must remain in that Division until the next year's membership card is purchased. At that time he may switch back to the Open Men's division, but must remain in that division until the next year's membership card is purchased.
 Note: See Rule 11, Section D.1 for additional information about re-qualifying.
- 2. Elder Women may pitch from any place on either the extended or full distance platforms and shall observe the twenty-foot (20') foul line. Elder Women must notify their Charter Membership Director, in advance, of the date that they intend to begin pitching from this shorter distance. Once a member declares oneself a shorter distance pitcher, they must remain in that Division until the next year's membership card is purchased. At that time, they may switch back to the Open Women's division, but must remain in that division until the next year's membership card is purchased.
 Note: See Rule 11, Section D.1 for additional information about re-qualifying
- 3. Physically Challenged Men Physically challenged Male pitchers less than sixty-five (65) years old may be given permission, by their governing Charter, to move onto the extended platforms in the Elders Division and observe the twenty-seven-foot (27') foul

lines. The prior completion and approval of a Medical Exemption Application form (available from Charter Secretaries and on some Charter Websites) is required. At the World Tournament and at State Championship Tournaments, they shall compete in the Elders Division

4. Physically Challenged Women - Physically challenged Female pitchers less than sixty-five (65) years old may be given permission, by their governing Charter, to move onto the extended platforms in the Elders Division and observe the twenty-foot (20') foul lines. The prior completion and approval of a Medical Exemption Application form (available from Charter Secretaries and on some Charter Websites) is required. At the World Tournament and at State Championship Tournaments, they shall compete in the Elders Division

NHPA Rational

We all know that this topic was discussed at the 2023 convention and nothing was passed. There was no suggested wording that could gain the majority to pass the proposal. This year we will discuss and make amendments in an orderly fashion and the delegates will decide whether or not a new Elders Women Division will be created.

If this PRC is defeated in its final version, the NHPA Council will re-issue a permanent Standing Rule. It can be discussed and voted on as stated in the current standing rule.

Here is the standing rule the NHPA would issue:

NHPA Standing Rule for Elder Women effective immediately.

Approved - - - - - - - - - Council Meeting

The following Standing rule was approved by the NHPA Council for Charters to use at Local, League and Regional Tournaments. This rule is being adopted so that all charters can use it at their discretion in Local and Regional Tournaments. Charters must identify which tournaments they will allow pitchers to participate using this standing rule and announce to all players at the start that it will be adopted for each tournament.

The NHPA Council is specifying that this rule will not be allowed in the following tournaments:

- Team World
- Sanction League Tournament
- 2024 World Tournament Warm Up Tournament
- 2024 World Tournament Prelims.

For State Tournaments this rule can be used if there are 4+ pitchers using it and they are put in their own class. They cannot be mixed in any women's class.

Proposed Bylaws/Rules Changes to be reviewed at the World Tournament

This Standing Rule will be presented at the 2024 Delegate meeting for review, modification and vote for approval by the Delegates.


Standing Rule for Senior Women at 65 years old

Senior Women turning sixty-five (65) during the calendar year may pitch from any place on the extended or full-distance platform and shall observe the Twenty foot (20") foul line.

These stats will be saved into eShoe to calculate their current average.

Anyone switching that wants to enter the 2024 World Tournament (WT) in the Senior Women category will have to observe the twenty-seven foot (27') foul line per the current adopted rule. Their average will be whatever is calculated upon entry deadline for the WT.



<u> ARRIVING AT THE TOYOTA CENTER – CHECKING IN</u>

Once you arrive at the Toyota Center and walk into the main doors, you will see a "Welcome Booth". You will register at the desk give your name and state and then you will receive your 2024 World Tournament "Welcome Bag". You will find various items in your bags, area information with sightseeing and tour information, as well as your 2024 World Tournament Program Book and World Tournament patch.

WHAT TO EXPECT ON YOUR FIRST DAY

As always, we have people attending the World Tournament for the first time. This year will be no exception. If you are a first-timer or a veteran attending the World Tournament, you will sometimes feel overwhelmed and intimidated on their first day. Lots of emotions are going on internally, from excitement to being scared and nervous. We have a few processes in place that are particularly important to follow and to help ease your stress levels. We will try our best to put your mind at ease and give you the information you will need to help you navigate through your World Tournament experience.

OPENING CEREMONIES:

This is your first day of competition and this will put the first day of the World running a little later than normal. The afternoon sessions will be pushed back from our normal schedule beginning with the second and third flights of the first day, so please be patient. Opening ceremonies are set to begin promptly at 11:00 am. and may last for an hour or so. If you are onsite at the venue, please stop by and attend. Austin Bailey (interim NHPA President), will be giving the opening and welcome speech to kick off the World Tournament as well as the Mayor of Kennewick, The Honorable Gretl Crawford will also be on hand, along with other local dignitaries. The National Anthem of the United States will be sung by Jim Kinney and the National Anthem of Canada will be sung by Mike Holley. The first horseshoe will be thrown out by the Mayor of Kennewick.

Look and listen for times for the later flights to begin after the opening ceremonies have concluded. Remember that on this first day, pitching schedules will not be on time after the first session has ended but will go back to your normally scheduled times on your second and third days of competition.

<u>"SAFETY" FIRST</u>

The Toyota Center and Toyota Arena, and NHPA policies: We want everyone to enjoy the tournament and your time with each other, however we need to be safe, considerate, and respectful of the competitors, spectators and the facility. Here are the Arena and Center requirements for both buildings. We want everyone to have a safe, fun time and a great World Tournament experience.

- Children must be accompanied at all times by an adult.
- No running or jumping in or on the arena seats and must always be seated when in the stands.
- No one is allowed in the upper arena areas, which will be blocked off. This area is for Arena Staff, NHPA and Office personal only.
- Any disruptive and/or disorderly persons should be reported to an NHPA shift director or an NHPA officer or the event staff personnel immediately.

WHERE TO GO WHEN YOU ARRIVE ONSITE:

ANNOUNCEMENTS:

On your first day of competition, you will need to go to the "Class Photo Room," located in the main Toyota Arena building, signs will be posted. You will be checked in by staff and you will be given your round robin card outside of the Class Photo Room. You will only do this process on your first day of competition. At this time, you will be asked what type of horseshoes you pitch and their weight, (The NHPA still maintains its historic files for horseshoes so that is why we need your information) and the back of your shirts will also be checked for accuracy and professional lettering requirements.

Each day after that, you will pick up your round robin cards at the leaderboard area on the tables outside the stat room just prior to your flight starting, signs will be posted. During the photo sessions, there will be a few important announcements made so "PAY CLOSE ATTENTION" to your shift director. Please "DO NOT LEAVE THE ROOM" until after the Shift director instructs you to do so. After this, you will be dismissed to head out to the competition floor. DO NOT TAKE THE COURTS TO BEGIN PRACTICE UNTIL YOU ARE DIRECTED TO DO SO.

There will be plenty of time to warm up so don't panic. Shift Directors will tell you when to start your games, so wait until that announcement is made to go onto the floor to your assigned courts. Please be respectful and mindful so as to not distract the people on the floor that are still pitching games. "NO" flash photography is allowed at any time in the arena area.

On days two and three, please be at the arena a minimum of 30 minutes prior to picking up your round robin card for the day. No other check-in is needed. **Again, do not walk out onto the courts to begin practice until you are directed to do so.** If for some reason you cannot pitch, or you are running late on the second or third day, please notify the NHPA World Tournament Director, Brian Poole (760)-315-3908 as far in advance as possible so a Pacer can be put in your place. We need to keep all sessions running on time if possible.

<u>CAN I BRING ALCOHOL OR OUTSIDE FOOD & DRINK INTO THE VENUE/LANSING CENTER?</u>

Each year, we ask the venues what their city ordinances, licensing, and ABC laws are regarding food, beverage, and alcohol allowances. In accordance with State Law of Washington, absolutely **NO Food or alcohol** can be brought onto the premises into either the Toyota Center and or the Auxiliary Building by clients, vendors, or attendees. Outside alcohol found on the premises (inside or outside includes all parking areas) will result in confiscation and the possibility of being barred from any service ending at that point and the entire time for the event. There are **NO** Water Bottles, Tumblers, Coolers, or insulated Lunch bags, or similar items, etc. allowed inside the venue.

Lansing Center's food and beverage department is the exclusive supplier for all food and beverage service on premises. The NHPA council asks that you please respect the local laws and ordinances as the NHPA has no control over how the venue conducts business.

COMPETITION DRESS REQUIREMENTS:

Per the NHPA RULE 12 - APPROPRIATE NHPA MEMBER CONDUCT

21 Section C - Dress Code:

All contestants competing in a World Tournament shall have, as a minimum, their last name and State or Country abbreviation "<u>Professionally</u>" lettered on the back of their shirts. Said shirts <u>cannot be sleeveless</u>. No <u>cut-offs</u> are permitted and <u>closed-toe shoes must be worn</u>. Further dress code restrictions may be imposed by the Executive Council if all entrants are notified no later than the mailing date of their pitching schedules. This Dress Code may also be adopted into any Charter Bylaws or may be enforced at any State Championship Tournament or at any local tournament, if announced in advance by the Tournament/League Officials. Contestants who do not comply may not be allowed to participate in the event.

Your shirts will be checked to make sure you have your name and state on the back. We ask/suggest that you Make sure the letters are "Professionally" lettered, at least a 1" in size, your name and state must be on the back of the shirt for score keepers to view. You will receive your round robin card for the first day. We appreciate your cooperation on this. Also, Please note the information that is on the entry form and on your schedule in your welcome bags. If you want to purchase/order and wear any shirts to compete in the tournament, you will need to have the vendor use this format requirements for lettering when placing you order.

COOL TEMPS IN THE ARENA

If you are sitting and watching the tournament as a spectator, please know in advance that the competitors/pitchers are very warm out on the competition floor. The temp in the arena will be around **65 degrees daily**, so bring a light jacket. Here are a few other suggestions and tips that will help you enjoy the World Tournament Experience.

HOW TO WATCH THE COMPETITION FROM THE SIDELINES OR STANDS.

- Binoculars if you're seated in the upper stands of the arenas.
- Wear Comfortable shoes and clothing.
- Bring cash and card and an ID card for purchasing concessions and Souvenirs.







One Month Out



What is the need for Sanctioned Leagues?

NHPA Sanctioned Leagues, why do we have them? This is the time of year most people are wrapping up their spring leagues, I'm beginning to get results from between one and three leagues almost every day. It's always great to see the high-level of participation in any of our NHPA sanction events, especially sanctioned leagues. Membership, Sponsorship, Promotion, and the thousands of other sanctioned events during the year, take precedent over the world tournament, or at least they should. It's been said before that the NHPA council has essentially became a "WT management group". This is a reasonable assessment given the state of the association. We have been on one of the sharpest membership declines in history for almost 20 years. We must begin focusing more on membership, sponsorship, and promotion from an NHPA council level. The world tournament as great as it is doesn't exist if there's no members left to pitch in it.

That brings me to sanction leagues. Now, I'm not saying that sanction leagues are the only thing we need to be doing more of to increase the membership, but it certainly helps. I've noticed in my local league that a few years back got down dwindled to just a few, but this year we have had 18 different pitchers that have pitched in our league before pitching in several other tournaments. Had it not been for a local sanction league in their area, they never would've been exposed to sanction horseshoe pitching and never would've gotten involved with the NHPA. Sanction leagues are valuable because they give you many things. A sanctioned league gives you: weekly practice with your peers, a way to consistently track your progress over a set period, qualifying events for larger events such as world and state tournaments, opportunities for more patches/awards, and much more! Most of all, leagues embrace the ideology of the NHPA, that the NHPA is a family-based organization. When we get together at world tournaments, and big tournaments across the country, it's like one big family reunion, Sanction leagues give you this atmosphere every single week that you hold the league in your area.

Another thing I would like to remind everyone of is once you get an NHPA sanction league number, you can run as many leagues during the year as you wish. The sanction league number is simply for tracking purposes on our end, including longevity. When a league is completed and I enter the stats into eShoe, those events get a unique eShoe tracking number, independent from the sanction league number. Anyone who is interested in starting a sanction league in your area please contact me at nhpaleagues@gmail.com to get started.

Youth, Experience, and Rocky Campaigns

Campaigns tend to get as competitive as any game of horseshoes you've ever pitched. After being on the campaign trail for several months and talking to many members in our great association, I have unsurprisingly heard many things, all along the same tune. The message being presented seems to always be the same, some in our association have pointed to my length of experience and my age, this is very interesting to me. Most of these opinions seem to have come from a lack of information, so I'll take these one at a time.

I would like for everyone to think back with me for a moment, at some point everyone reading this was my age weren't you? While I know my youthful appearance can be confusing, I'm not as young as most people seem to think, if I were my hairline wouldn't look like it did today. 2024 is my 19th season as an NHPA sanctioned member, this is also my 9th year in the open men's division. I've been around awhile, and I've seen a lot in my 19 years as an NHPA sanctioned member. I grew up in the sport, I saw the good, the bad, the pretty, and the ugly. I've seen good things and I've seen the bad things; I've seen a few corrupt things. Over the last almost 20 years I have personally watched the tournament attendance sharply decline across the nation, as the membership declined and with it I've watched the attendance of the world tournament decline too.

Along with my personal experience and my experience as an NHPA member, youth is not necessarily a bad thing. Youth means a lot of things: youth means higher energy, fresh ideas, a step forward, not backwards. Some have questioned my dedication to the game and energy for pitching in tournaments, but anyone who knows me knows that I am a proponent of sticking to the facts. The facts are that in the past calendar year I've pitched more tournaments than any other candidate on any ticket this year, and more events than any current member of the NHPA council, but pitching isn't everything when it comes to the presidency.

I am and have been the NHPA youth director for the past three seasons, I was appointed NHPA third vice president in December 2023. I was a Kentucky vice president for three years and I've played a vital role in keeping my local club in Chalybeate, Kentucky active and growing during the overall NHPA membership decline. Getting down to work experience, I grew up on a small-town farm in Brownsville, Kentucky. From a very young age I learned the awards business that my dad had run before taking that business over several years ago and still running it today. My family also owned a small business in Bowling Green, Kentucky, the third largest metropolis in Kentucky. During this time, I successfully managed all aspects of the business, from staffing, to budgeting, to compliance. My working career quickly transitioned to the automotive field where I worked as a welder for a couple of years before transitioning to another manufacturing facility in Bowling Green, Kentucky as a lead for several years. After this, I became a supervisor at another start-up manufacturing facility, producing components for some of the largest automotive manufacturers in the nation. I fully managed a team of 75+ employees, completely getting the overnight shifts off the ground and exceeding the results of the more tenured shifts. After leaving this company, I transitioned to my current role managing teams in almost a dozen different areas at any given time. In this role, I fully manage each account as if it were my own, managing all aspects of each account.

The NHPA is a fully membership funded organization, the members of that organization demand that someone responsibly manages and grows their funds to ensure its stability in the future. I have the experience to do this as I've managed projects with exponentially higher budgets than the NHPA currently operates on.

Most of all the NHPA membership demands transparency to their members. Since I've been campaigning, I've received a little criticism over not releasing a full plan to the membership. There is a very simple explanation for this. My plan includes a multi-tier, multiyear, and multilevel sponsorship overhaul to gain those valuable sponsorship dollars that we've been missing for so many years. Part of this plan is to begin with lower-level sponsorships that will be critical to getting us back off the ground. My plan in its entirety is several pages but, in the end, my plan is very simple. My plan includes gaining those valuable sponsorship dollars then allocating those funds right back to the membership, kicking much of them back to the charters. We must help the charters increase their membership; we must provide them with the tools to do this. It's easy for the NHPA council to sit back and preach that the burden of membership falls solely on the charters, this is simply wrong.


Think to yourself how many times in the last 20 years have you heard an NHPA officer brag about a minor success that they've had but passed the blame on something they failed at. The NHPA President bears the success of the NHPA, but they also **must** bear the responsibility of the downfalls.

There are many things we need to do in addition to the few that I've mentioned. I would argue that this is one of the most critical elections in the history of the NHPA. I simply bring to the table a young, experienced leader, ready to step up to the plate and push the NHPA forward in a positive direction of growth. Ask yourself this, when experience matters is the amount of experience more important than the quality of the experience?

As I've said in previous articles, I'm confident that I can help in turning the direction of the NHPA. I'm so confident that if elected, were I to fail in gaining sponsorships and curving the projection of the NHPA membership, I would not seek reelection. How many terms should it take to get it right? Seeking the NHPA presidency for me isn't about ego, it's about ensuring a strong association for the next generation of horseshoe pitchers. My interest in becoming the president of this great association is simply to uphold the primary purpose of the NHPA many have down through the years seemingly forgotten: "the purpose of the NHPA shall be to develop, foster, and promote organized horseshoe pitching at the local, state, regional, national, and international levels; as a recreational pastime and as a competitive sport; by providing direction, organization, published materials, and approved equipment; in an effort to enhance the sport." If we follow our purpose as it was founded, we can ensure our future.

If we fail to uphold this purpose any longer, horseshoe pitching will continue to fade and quickly become a thing of the past. The foundation of the NHPA is fundamentally cracked, we must fix our systems/ processes if we wish to succeed. We must get back to our values, we must take a moral, responsible path forward. When we begin to set forth a solid foundation, building off of that, and listening to the needs of every member, that's when we will see success.

I appreciate the support of each and every person who has supported me in this election and I appreciate your continued support and your vote in the Tri-Cities this summer. When you speak to your local delegates and charter officials remember, when experience matters vote Ben Webb for NHPA President in the 2024 election






