

With our revised standard operating procedures now complete and soon to be uploaded on the website, we have established a clear direction for each officer, committee member and our association as a whole. # **Updates for 2025**

## Youth Membership Fees Waived

The NHPA Council unanimously voted to waive youth membership dues for 2025. Many states have also elected to waive youth dues for the coming season. This allows our youth pitchers to participate in 2025 events at very reduced or even no cost for the 2025 season!

# Early Bird Pricing for 2025 World Tournament

World Tournament entries are open earlier than normal this year! With more than 50 pitchers already signed up for the 2025 event, we're anticipating a large turnout in Sandy, Utah for the World Tournament! Our World Tournament entry fee increased slightly this year to \$150 per adult entrant. However, there is early bird pricing in effect until February 1<sup>st</sup>. Take advantage of this early bird pricing of \$130 and get your entry in early for the 2025 World Tournament!

# World Doubles Championship

The Sanctioned League Tournament in Wentzville has been declining in participation numbers for many years, something players have been asking for much longer than this though is a World Doubles Tournament. We currently have a verbal commitment from the Quail Ridge club and we're currently looking to host the first World Doubles Championship in Wentzville in 2025 around the same time as the Sanctioned League Tournament would have normally been. Once the details of this are finalized, we'll make an official announcement regarding the installation of the new event.

### **Quarterly Meetings**

We will be shifting away from zoom in 2025 but beginning to utilize teams for our monthly council and committee meetings. We will also begin to schedule quarterly meetings for sanctioned league directors, regional directors and one for charter officers. These meetings will be filled with updates about what's taking place from the council level and I encourage you to join whenever you're able. Be on the lookout for e-Blasts about these meetings as they're scheduled.

# Our Focus in 2025

2025 is the year in which the NHPA will fully shift its efforts away from full World Tournament focus and back onto the full scope of organized horseshoe pitching, it's original purpose. The NHPA was never established to essentially run one singular event but to promote and foster the growth of organized horseshoe pitching everywhere, year-round. This is the focus of our council, our committees, our directors and our partners as we enter the new year. True membership growth will come from the charter level, but the NHPA will be behind those charters 100%. In the coming days, there will be forms online for your charter officers, tournament directors, and other promoters needing assistance from the NHPA to request that needed help. We will be able to provide different types of aid depending on the need of the individual request. Some examples of this would be: Custom fliers for your event, banners for your events, promotional assistance for your organization and events, etc. We are focused and committed to fostering this growth on a local level with you and your associated organization, I look forward to the installation of these new efforts to grow our membership in 2025 and the growth those efforts will yield!

# **Nominations Open**

Nominations are now open for all NHPA awards to be presented at the annual NHPA banquet in Sandy at the 2025 World Tournament. Hall of Fame, Arch Stokes Award, VanSant Award, League Director of the Year, Achievement Awards, All of these categories are open for nominations. If you have an individual you feel is worthy of one of these awards, please find those nomination forms and submit those to the responsible individual as soon as possible for 2025 consideration.

One thing we began in 2024 was to give achievement awards on a more frequent basis, not just at the world tournament. Consistent with our mission there is much work done for the NHPA outside of the annual world tournament and we felt it would be best to honor those who do the ground work that may never attend the annual event. This started in 2024 with an achievement award to Robert Taylor of Kentucky for his countless hours of work to preserve our sports history, along with his work as a dedicated Kentucky officer for many years before stepping into the Kentucky presidency in 2024. Jerry Smith became the second person to receive one of these independent achievement awards, receiving the award at the 2024 Sanctioned League tournament in Wentzville, Missouri, for the second time in his career. Although Jerry left the council at the end of 2023, Jerry continued to help train new council members and devote countless hours assisting the council in 2024 during the difficult year. There are often times we don't know of these individuals doing this work on the ground level, which is why I appeal to you for your nominations.

Do you have a devoted charter official, promoter, league/club leader who has dedicated countless hours of work to grow our sport in your area? Fill out the nomination form listed on our website to put that person up for nomination of one of these NHPA achievement awards! The NHPA council will review and carefully consider each form we receive; we want to recognize these individuals even if they don't attend our annual world tournament.

Jerry LaBrosse and his rules committee are now taking proposals for changes at the 2025 convention, please see Jerry's article in this Newsline for information about 2025 proposals.

We're always seeking members to join our committees for the growth of our organization, if you're interested in joining any of our committees please contact me or the committee chair for more information about how you can get involved in the NHPA's leadership teams.

2025 council elections are also on the horizon. This year will see the 1<sup>st</sup> Vice President (incumbent Austin Bailey), and 3<sup>rd</sup> Vice President (incumbent Jerry LaBrosse), up for election. Candidates must submit their candidacy, in writing, to the NHPA President and Newsline editor no later than April 1<sup>st</sup>, Incumbent's deadline is February 1<sup>st</sup>, per the NHPA bylaws. If you're considering running for one of these positions in 2025, please be mindful of and submit your candidacy by these deadlines.





# What would it have been like?

In my last article, I talked about preparation for big events. We talked about Christmas & the importance of preparing our hearts for this great event! I trust that you all had a wonderful time of celebration of our Savior coming to this earth. Also, I trust that you had a blessed time with family.

So, what was life like, for those witnessing the life that Jesus lived, while here on this earth? I don't know about you, but if God came to earth ... I would expect His words to be absolutely amazing.



Three commonly used words by the Gospels writers, concerning Jesus were: Astonished, Marveled & Amazed – it is the idea of being blown away or shocked by something. These were the words used over & over again of those who heard Jesus. People were constantly blown away after hearing Jesus speak. For example ...

Matt. 7:28 at the end of the Sermon on the Mount "... when Jesus had ended these sayings, that the people were astonished at His teaching ..."

Matt. 13:54 "... He taught them in their synagogue, so that they were astonished and said, "Where did this Man get this wisdom ..."

Matt. 22:33 "And when the multitudes heard this, they were astonished at His teaching."

Mark 1:21-22 "... He entered the synagogue and taught. And they were astonished at His teaching ..."

Many other passages speak of the same response: see Mark 6:2, Mark 10:24, Mark 11:18, Luke 2:47, Luke 4:32, Mark 1:27, Mark 10:32, Luke 4:36, Matt. 22:22, John 7:15.

In English class, I remember being told that repeating the same words again & again, are not a good thing to do. They are both distracting & insulting to the readers intelligence. But think about it, what other words could describe the reaction of people, to what Jesus said? Astonished, Amazed & Marveled!! Think about it, if God came to earth, shouldn't we expect to hear unbelievable things? No one could speak as God could speak, and no one had the knowledge or the wisdom that God has. It was always astonishing.

Jesus was more than just a man. He was God in the flesh. John describes Jesus as the Word, the Living Word of God. John 1:1 says "In the beginning was the Word and the Word was with God and the Word was God." And 1:16 it says "And the Word was made flesh and dwelt among us and we beheld His glory". We saw it. God revealed Himself in the Person of Jesus. God communicated with us in Jesus. Jesus is the bridge between God and man. John would record Jesus' own words to Philip "He who has seen Me has seen the Father" John 14:9.

Jesus, the Living Word of God, is fully God and yet fully man. He came to reveal God to man and redeem all who believe in Him & save them from their sin.

Listen my friends, it's critical that we understand this! It's absolutely essential to deal with His claims. These are astonishing claims that He made and they demand an honest look at Him because He says our eternal souls are at stake. Where you spend forever is at issue here, and you will live somewhere forever, in one of only two places.

My fellow horseshoe pitchers, I leave you with this. Jesus said in John 14:6, "I am the way, the truth, and the life; no man cometh unto the Father, but by me."

This thought-provoking statement deserves careful consideration.

me. All of you who have tournaments scheduled for January should have received them by now. If you have not sent me your patch order and you have tournaments in January, please email them to me as soon as possible. I am pleased to announce that the council has voted and decided to keep the year on them this year. They really went up in price so we will re-evaluate this again for next year. This topic will also be discussed for Sanction League Patches as well and at the President/RD/Sanction League meeting at the World Tournament in Salt Lake City, UT. Time and date of meeting will be announced as soon as I have that information.

Once again in 2025, I will be asking for volunteers to help me with player check-in at the World Tournament. Check-in occurs on the Monday and Thursday of the 1<sup>st</sup> week and Monday and Thursday of the 2<sup>nd</sup> week. Times for check-in are based on the pitching schedule and the number of entries. Please let me know if you would be willing to volunteer. It usually takes about 30 minutes out of your day to get everyone checked in. Thank you in advance for your consideration.

In regards to your orders for RGS Books, there is not a new version of this book yet. Jerry Labrosse, 3<sup>rd</sup> VP Rules/ByLaws Director is currently updating this book. Meanwhile, you can find this book on the NHPA Website under RULES. The new rule that I am excited about is the new Division for the Elder Women that was passed at the 2024 Convention in Washington. When switching to the new EW Division from the Women's Division to the new EW Division, you must be 65 and older and you must throw 100 shoes to re-qualify at the new pitching distance. The re-qualification results must be sent to your State Secretary to be changed in eShoe. This new EW division is also available this year at the 2025 World Tournament. Just circle the EW Division on your WT Entry Form. Come on ladies, let's all sign-up and show everyone that even though we are older women that we still have what it takes to be a World Tournament Champion.

This year at the HOF Banquet, to be held at the World Tournament, I will be presenting the Regional Director of the Year award to the outstanding 2025 RD. I will also have the pleasure of presenting the outstanding Sanction League Director of the Year award. # 2025 World Tournament...See who has entered!



Entries received with a postmark after May 19, 2025 shall be put on a waiting list and entered into the World Tournament only as spaces are available. All Adults must have pitched in a minimum of four (4) US/Canadian sanctioned events in the twelve (12) months prior to May 19, 2025 in the same division you are entering. Only one (1) event is required for Juniors/Cadets. Exceptions for US Armed Forces members and family and Foreign competitors (other than Canadians) are outlined in Rule 11, Sec D.1 of the RGS Book. Contact NHPA for more information regarding qualifying exceptions. All Averages used will be the average on record in NHPA-eShoe as of May 19, 2025. Anyone qualifying under an exception must have those scores recorded by the same date. All NHPA and any special tournament rules apply. Please see note regarding refunds.

READ CAREFULLY: Any Adult male pitching from the full distance platform may enter the OPEN Men's Division regardless of age, just as any Adult Female may enter the OPEN Women's Division. To enter the Senior Division, you must be 60 years of age or older before the end of 2025. Any Man/Women that turns 65 years of age in 2025, or has an approved Medical exemption may enter the Elders Division. Entrants in the Junior Boys and Junior Girls Division must be 18 years old or less for the entire 2025 calendar year. Cadet Boys & Cadet Girls Division entrants must be 12 years old or younger for the entire 2025 calendar year.

NOTE #1: 30 ft Men with a Medical Exemption must be in NHPA eShoe as "Exempt" to pitch in this Division. A copy of the Exemption Form must be sent with this application.

NOTE #2: For Prelim Class play, a minimum of 48 pitchers must enter Sr Division's or it may be canceled. All entrants will then pitch in the Open Division if canceled.

NOTE #3: Junior Boys & Junior Girls Divisions will be mixed for preliminary class play. Cadet Boys & Cadet Girls Divisions will be mixed for preliminary class play.

The pitching schedule will be finalized by May 31, 2025 and published on the NHPA website <a href="www.horseshoepitching.com">www.horseshoepitching.com</a>. If you indicate above to receive the schedule by mail, it will be mailed to the address you have listed above during the 2nd week in June. Please write address clearly & readable.

Please note: The NHPA reserves the right to disallow your participation for any of the following reasons: Any errors on this form, if your records don't appear in NHPA eShoe or any false or misleading information on this form, cannot validate Medical Exemption, or for any other reason by majority vote of the NHPA Council. The NHPA also reserves the right to add qualified entrants and to make class participant changes after the above deadline. No pitcher will be moved from a class or pitching time, without notification, after the final schedule has been published.

One interesting thing about our publication over the years is the names:


Barnyard Golf	1922-1923	2 years

The National Horseshoe Pitchers Foundation was originally formed to construct, maintain, and operate a museum, library, and hall of fame devoted to the game of horseshoes, which will provide the public with an opportunity to better understand the history and development of the game of horseshoes and the people associated with it. The Foundation's sole member is the NHPA. The Foundation's Board of Directors are nominated and elected by the NHPA's Executive Council. The NHPA President also serves on this Board.

Funding for the museum comes from a variety of sources, but primarily from NHPA members. Contributions to support the museum are tax deductible and can be made in a variety of ways. Cash, check, or purchase a brick on the outdoor plaza and honor someone you know that enjoyed this great game in their lifetime.



As with any outdoor structure, the building that houses the museum occasionally needs to undergo some maintenance. This year we had to have some minor maintenance done to the roof and also have it repainted. The total cost of this project was around \$70,000. Fortunately this only has to be done every 10 years or so.

It is our hope that every member of the horseshoe pitching community gets a chance to visit this wonderful facility. In it you will find a display highlighting the accomplishments of all the members of the NHPA Hall of Fame. In this Newsline issue we'd like to feature a couple of individuals who made their impact on the sport not so much as elite players, but from the devotion they showed to the game itself.

# Inducted in 1970: Frank Ellis Cobb (Illinois) Organizer:

Ellis Cobb earned a firm place in history by his outstanding contribution to the game as editor of the Horse-shoe Pitcher's News Digest. He began producing the Digest in 1956, and growth in membership can be attributed to the publication. He remained editor of the Digest for 32 years, through 1988. Ellis was presented a lifetime NHPA membership, the Presidential Award in 1987 and the Stokes Memorial Award in 1962. A fitting touch as it was Arch Stokes, while serving as NHPA President, who summoned Ellis to become the new editor replacing Byron Jaskulek, as editor of the Digest. Ellis served as Illinois Association as Secretary for over 30 years and had many other efforts in service to the sport. He posed as a model for several companies in their making of figurines for horseshoe pitching trophies. He was instrumental in getting the Championship Horseshoe series on NBC television in the Chicago area in 1956. Ellis Cobb passed away June 15, 1994, at age 84.

### **Inducted in 1969: Bob Pence (Indiana) Organizer:**

Bob Pence was seemingly born possessed with an undying love for the game of horseshoes. He was an incredible promoter of the sport, a prolific writer of horseshoe pitching articles, and traveled thousands of miles each year in his efforts to boost his favorite sport.



Bob was a good pitcher, with better than a 70% ringer average and joined the NHPA in 1929. Bob was Secretary of the Indiana Association for five or six years before being elected Secretary-Treasurer of the National Association in 1958, a position he held for 24 years. Under his administration several improvements were implemented: Classes C & D were added to the Men's division, the Women's division was expanded to include B & C, a Junior Girls division was begun in 1967, and the Senior Men's division was implemented as well as the Intermediate Men's division. The World Tournament was rotated around the country to help in recruiting more new members. He initiated Game Related Sales, which the NHPA benefited from with increased revenue. He also instituted championship patches and recognition awards and the NHPA Hall of Fame was established in 1965 with his guidance. Bob Pence was awarded the Arch Stokes Memorial Award in 1961. He passed away May 18, 2002.

# Registering tips for new and returning pitchers!

Christmas is just a few days past and 2025 is coming right behind it. 2024 was a great year for some milestones within the NHPA. The eShoe program has been working great with tracking members and scheduling events. There are new features that have been written into the program, but we are in the test stage and have not yet released them.

The NHPA has been trying to educate the pitchers and the charters on navigating the eShoe program when members are searching, changing, or renewing within the NHPA. One of the main areas some members are not realizing is the renewal on the website. When a new pitcher to the NHPA wants to join they would be directed to the NHPA website at <a href="https://www.horseshoepitching.com">www.horseshoepitching.com</a> and click on the "JOIN" button



which will take them to a form to fill out all their contact information. If a pitcher who has already been a member of the NHPA wants to renew their membership they would go the NHPA website and choose the "RENEW" button that will take you to the eShoe main page. Once you are at the <a href="www.nhpa-eshoe.com">www.nhpa-eshoe.com</a>
page you will enter your name, or your membership number. When you see your name click on it and this will bring up your Player information. At this time, you would choose "Renew" to renew your membership. If your division is not the correct division or if you cannot complete this process, you would have to contact your Charter Membership Director/Secretary. If a current member chooses the "JOIN" button it will create a new membership number for them and the member will have two numbers associated with their name. The members' years along with the events played in the prior 12 months will not be able to update with the membership number they have held in the past. This is an easy fix, but we encourage members to make sure and choose the right button when joining or renewing.

Another area in the eShoe program that some pitchers, tournament directors, and secretaries are not sure of is the changing of division. When a member changes division, they will not be able to renew on the website with the new division. The members will have to contact their Charter Membership Director/Secretary to have their division changed. They can do this before they renew online or after. Also with the division change the member will have to reestablish their ringer percentage by pitching 100 shoes at the new division. Once the member has pitched 100 shoes their pitching percentage can be entered in eShoe by the tournament director manually when setting up their tournament or the Membership Director/Secretary can enter it into any tournament that has already been reported by adding the member in the tournament with the shoes pitched and the ringers only. This will allow any tournament director to be able to pull the member from eShoe with the percentage created. We recommend that the member be deleted from the tournament where they were initially added once they have completed their first event so eShoe does not count the 100 shoes pitched as an event.

The NHPA eShoe Director is aware that there is going to be mistakes made while entering members contact information, entering tournament information, or just entering general information within eShoe. The NHPA is here to help members or Membership Directors/Secretaries with anything within eShoe that needs to be addressed. This is only possible if everyone helps monitor his/her information and reports anything that needs to be addressed. Please contact me with any questions concerning eShoe.

# Valley of the Sun Tournament

The East Valley Horseshoe Club hosted the 66<sup>th</sup> annual Valley of the Sun horseshoe tournament this year in Mesa, Arizona as the longest running NHPA tournament in the United States. This tournament has players from almost half of all states represented along with Canada. Results of this year's Valley of the Sun tournament may be seen. Go to e-shoe events, and put in the date of February 29 in Arizona. Some of the best and some of the least best players come to play each year for many reasons, they come for the competition, a vacation from wintry weather, to visit friends and family and to enjoy two days of playing horseshoes.

This year's A Class winners were Men: Jacob Fimbres 10-0 w/l record (7-time winner), Elders Mike Massari 9-1 (4-time winner) w/l record, A-30 mixed J.D Drake won with a 11-0 record. In B Classes B-Mixed was won by Roy Callaway going 8-2 In B Men Adam Rodriquez won with a 10-3 w/l after winning a playoff. All A and B classes play on Saturday and Sunday.

This year's tournament may be seen in pictures. We take class pictures, winner pictures and action shot pictures. All our pictures are free, for class and winner pictures you may go to our Arizona website ashpa.club, open Valley of the Sun, and view pictures. For action shots our camera person will take a couple of pictures and send them to you when they have them sorted out. All you need to do is ask for the action shot when the tournament starts. No money required. If you want a picture to frame or add to your personal file just download the pictures from our website. You can then print them or take them to a photo shop and have them printed. These are high quality pictures just like the World Tournament.

All A and B classes play 40-point games, all other classes play either 40 or 50 shoes. Classes are 6 player double round robin or 12 player single round robin classes. Every effort is made to separate 30' players from 40' players. There are no handicaps except for the very last class which may have more than a 15% difference between the high and low average. All games have score keepers with score boards. All ties for first place have a playoff. Half of all players will win money. In a 12-player class, payouts go to 6<sup>th</sup> place, in 6-player class payouts to 3<sup>rd</sup> place. All classes receive the same payouts. What A classes get, G class gets the same. This year we had \$6,847 to split between classes after all expenses (score keepers, brochures, paper etc.). All donations or sponsors are welcome.

We welcome all players to enter the **2025 Valley of the Sun Tournament.** The deadline for entry is January 14. Games will be held between February 18 and 23. Tuesday and Wednesday February 18-19 will be used if needed. On February 15, the Saturday before we have a warmup tournament at our Mesa site. All contact information for the Saturday tournament is on e-shoe Arizona events. View Dalton Rakestraw's Valley of the Sun Podcast on you tube for some tournament history.

In two days with only twelve courts, we can only host forty-eight players per two days. We have two sessions, one in the morning and one in the afternoon. For four days of play we can only host ninety-six players. We will use Tuesday and Wednesday only if we get 108 or more players entered. All players after the first ninety-six will be placed on a waiting list. Enter now! If you mail in your entry in the last week before the deadline, please notify me that your check is in the mail. The waiting list starts when entry is received. Remember it is the holidays, and mail may take 3-6 days to be received. You may also Zelle your entry. # Missouri #1 Defeats Wisconsin #1 in Amazing Final Match to Take Team World Title

Wisconsin #1 entered Team World this year with an intent to win a 5th title in a row. This team, consisting of Sarah Chaffee, Penny Steinke, Jim Bilderback, and John Nawrot once again dominated over the rest of the field of teams in preliminary roundrobin play and earned the top seed in the finals with a 79-13 record. The team also earned a bye in the first finals round by being the top team in the round robin. They defeated Ohio 3-1 in the second finals round to advance to the championship round for the 5<sup>th</sup> time in a row. Missouri #1 finished second in the prelims with a 70-22 record. This determined Missouri #1 team consisting of Virgle McCown, Pam Meyer, Jennifer Gegg, and Jason Weiler elevated their game in the finals taking 3 of 4 from Minnesota #1 in the first finals round and all 4 games against Illinois #1 in the second finals round. Missouri #1 bested the defending champions in the final round to end Wisconsin's run as Team World Champions at 4-in-a-row. The final match was one for the ages. John Nawrot defeated Jason Weiler 32-18. This 14-point margin could be critical as a 2-2 tie in wins in the finals is broken by total team points in the round. Virgle McCown faced Sarah Chaffee. The score was 6-3 in favor of Sarah at 20 shoes, but Virgle ran away with an 18-10 victory. The two had ten 4-deads, and 7 in a row, in the 40- shoe match but Virgle's 90% game was too good for Sarah to match as she pitched 82.5% in the loss. Pam Meyer faced Penny Steinke. This game was even more intense than the McCown vs Chaffee match. It too was 6-3 at 20 shoes in favor of Pam. These two had seven 4-deads in these first 10 frames of the game and 11 for the game. Pam was able to extend her lead to 10-3 at 30 shoes. However, Penny closed that lead down to 10-9 with two shoes remaining. Pam was able to add a 2-dead-3 in the last frame to win 13-9 and had 35 ringers (87.5%) to Penny's 34 ringers (85.0%). With 3 games finished, Missouri had a 2-1-win advantage but trailed Wisconsin in total points 49-51. Jennifer Gegg was pitching against Jim Bilderback. Wisconsin #1 would win the title if Jim defeated Jennifer since they had a 2-point total point advantage from the combination of the other 3 games. However, Jennifer was able to hold off Jim and won the game 28-24 to seal the 3<sup>rd</sup> win in the round to win the Team World title. THIS WAS A TRULY AMAZING FINALS FINISH!!

Competition for 3<sup>rd</sup> place was taking place at the same time as the finals match. Ohio lost to Wisconsin #1 and Illinois #1 was defeated by Missouri #1 in the semi-finals. These two teams faced each other to determine which team would earn 3<sup>rd</sup> place. Alan Francis defeated Austin Bailey 30-11. However, Paul Littlefield defeated Don Epps 31-11 to tie the round 1-1 and take a total points advantage of 42-41 for Illinois. Steve Denault defeated Amy Francis 24-21 to take a 2-1 lead and a 66-62 total point advantage. Ed Hildreth defeated Ken Schaver to make the match a 2-2 tie, but his 20-18 victory was too close as Illinois held the tiebreaker with an 84-82 total point advantage and a 3<sup>rd</sup> place finish. 
Team World had a record 29 teams entered this year. In fact, it was the first time in the event's 38-year history that the committee received more entries than the 24-team limit. The committee does not fill the rosters on a first come basis. There is priority placed on getting representatives from as many different states as possible and fielding the most competitive field of teams as well. Therefore, the 5 teams with the lowest team entering ringer percentage averages from states that had more than 1 team enter, were the teams that were placed outside of the 24-team group. We encourage all that were turned away to enter a team again. We were fortunate to see the return of Drew Becker and his team from Ontario, Canada, to host a second year in a row of international competition at Team World. The following states were represented at Team World: California, Illinois (2), Iowa, Michigan (4), Minnesota (4), Missouri (3), Ohio, Washington, and Wisconsin (5).

Another notable for 2024 was Team World's first pitcher from a junior division as 14-year-old Hastiin Begaye was a member of the California team. Hastiin was not intimidated by the adult competition as he finished with a 19.5-3.5 record and pitched 74% for the tournament. He lost to Alan Francis on day 1 and defeated Drew Becker on day 2. California fell just short of making the 7-team finals as they ended up finishing in 8<sup>th</sup> place. Team World also featured a head-to-head match between the reigning Women's and Men's world champions, Sarah Chaffee and Alan Francis, for a second consecutive year. However, this time the two met once in the prelims and a second time in the semi-finals. Alan was able to make the series record 3-0 by defeating Sarah 25-20 in the prelims and again 21-18 in the semi-finals pitching 34 ringers to Sarah's 33 ringers.

The Earl Paulson Team World Award is given out in honor of Earl Paulson and was created to give recognition to some of the greatest pitchers and contributors that have participated in Team World. The award presentation took place on Saturday afternoon. Paul LaCrosse and Penny Steinke were this year's recipients of the award. Paul participated in 14 Team World tournaments and his Colorado teams won 6 times from 2000-2009. Paul's career Team World ringer percentage is 69.55%, which is 5<sup>th</sup> highest among pitchers with 10 or more tournaments played. Penny has participated in 12 Team World Tournaments and is the only pitcher to win Team World 4 times in a row and averaged 74.2% over those 4 years. Paul and Penny join Dale Lipovsky, Charlie Webb, Sue Snyder, and Alan Francis as Team World Award recipients.

The Beloit Horseshoe Club and Team World Committee are looking forward to hosting Team World again next year. Whether you have played in the past or have never participated, mark your calendars, and consider being a part of the 39<sup>th</sup> Team World Tournament in Beloit, WI, May 16, 17, & 18, 2025. There is truly no other tournament like Team World.
