NHPF Grant Qualification

There is no requirement for a club applying for a grant to be registered with the state or feds as a non-profit. Ideally, the club would be part of an NHPA charter but that also is not a requirement. One thing to keep in mind is that the NHPF cannot grant funds to an individual or a club if the money is to be used to make permanent improvements on privately owned property. NHPF grant checks must be issued to organized clubs, associations, city, county, state or federal entities where the funds will be used to enhance horseshoe pitching opportunities open to the general public. NHPA clubs with courts on public owned land qualify because they are open to the general public. If a club or charter is leasing a privately owned site, indoor or out, the NHPF could provide funds for portable courts to be used at those sites because ownership of the courts stays with the club or charter and no funds were used to improve the privately owned site.

Welcome Any and All!

One of the attractions to our sport is the friendly atmosphere and family culture. Unfortunately, there can be some who take things too personally, make unnecessary comments and cause hard feelings. These actions are not good. Things said in anger or in a hurtful, confrontational manner have no business on the courts.

There is no reason for rude, obnoxious behavior and does nothing to promote the game of horseshoes. Would you want to join a sport where animosity is open and obvious? Not sure I would. We celebrate fairness, friendliness and welcome any and all who come to the pits. Don't be the one who strays from this theme and foments anger and turmoil. We are all ambassadors to recruit new members, and should take pride in the way we treat one another. I am certain that your Gramma told you more than once "If you can't say something nice about someone, keep your thoughts to yourself." Good advice any time.

Pitching shoes are made quite differently from the handmade ones of the old blacksmith. They are now forged, using expensive and modern drop-forging hammers. A long bar of special analysis steel is heated to a cherry red in oilfired furnaces. The bar is then bent at the end like a walking cane. This end is placed on a die block and hammered by a weighted die of about 2,000 pounds. This pounding of the steel into a shaped cavity forms the pitching shoe by a method called "drop forging." The excess metal is trimmed away and the edges smoothed.

Heat treating, or hardening, pitching shoes is an exacting process. Making the shoes too soft is not desirable, because they would nick easily. Neither is too hard a shoe desirable, because it would bounce off the stake.

HOW TO: THROW A RINGER

In horseshoes, "Almost" doesn't need to count for Alan Francis. The world champion pitcher from Defiance, Ohio, first competitively hurled equine kicks when he was 9, and won his first world championship 10 years later. This year, he'll be going for his 30th international title near Salt Lake City, UT, while mingling with the other 800+ chuckers who competed in four National Horseshoe Pitchers Association tourneys to qualify. Despite the suffocating pressure, the printing-company rep was gracious enough to break from his pre-tourney prep to demonstrate a few tosses.

THE ONE-AND-A-QUARTER TURN

Men toss from 40 feet; women, juniors, and elders from 30. Elder women from 20 feet. One target fits all: a 36" x 1" stake. How to propel the shoe from one end of the pit to the other? Most of the NHPA's 7,450-plus members hold it by one shank with the opening facing left (or right, for lefties). Now, from standing with feet together, step forward as you swing your arm in a bowler's motion. Just before your arm levels out, release. A slight right wrist twist will get it to spin 450° clockwise. If all goes to plan, it will hug the post.

THE ONE-AND-THREE-QUARTERS TURN

Pitchers tally one point if the shoe lands within six inches of the stake, three if the shoe ends up around it (a ringer). Matches are broken into innings in which players alternate two throws each. Similar tosses—say, two ringers cancel each other out as pitchers race to 40 points. For the most part, this throw is basically the one described above, except this time the shoe is held with the opening to the right, and more wrist oomph is used to get that extra half-turn. To each chucker his own grip.

THE THREE-QUARTER TURN

This one is held like the one-and-three-quarters but is thrown to slow the rotation. The toss was deemed impractical until Francis won his first title, in 1989, with it. His version is a variation: With the opening facing left, he applies a counterclockwise spin. Players on tour are ranked by ringer percentages (total throws divided by ringers); Francis, about a 90% hurler, says his unique grip came naturally. The man has a gift. In one tourney, he threw 54 straight ringers.

THE FLIP

This does what the name suggests. With the shoe held in the middle of the arch, it's the grip used by most backyard pitchers, as well as the majority of pro women, elder men and juniors, because it's the easiest to throw consistently. Francis' wife, Amy, has been a runner-up at worlds three times with the flip, and Francis says she's "knocking on the door" for the 2025 title. If she wins, she'll take home the same \$5,000 her husband hopes to. Chucking soul mates—who says horseshoes aren't good luck?
