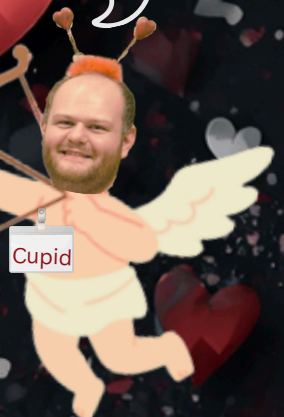

Danny Kuchcinski
Erie, Pennsylvania



Danny started pitching at the age of ten. He won his first World Title at the age of 18 in 1967 in Fargo, North Dakota, being the youngest winner since 1933. He won world championships again in 1969 and 1970. He averaged over 84% ringers in each of his three championships, while losing only two games and winning 103 games. He had a streak of 66 consecutive ringers.

Danny married Women's World Champion Sue Gillespie and together had a traveling exhibition that toured all the United States and Canada. Their act was witnessed by millions of viewers on television, including the Johnny Carson Show and even a show in Japan.

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Tech Tips from the NHPA

Do you ever get tired of scrolling forever through a huge webpage, document, or email just to find a certain word? There's an easy trick: just hit Ctrl + F (or Command + F if you're on a Mac). A little search box pops up, and you can type what you're looking for—it'll show you every spot where it shows up, so you can go straight to it. This works pretty much everywhere—browsers, Word, PDFs, spreadsheets, and even some apps you wouldn't think of. Like, if you're looking through some long instructions or rules and want to find something about "passwords," just press Ctrl + F, type "password," and you'll see every place it's mentioned. No need to read the whole thing! Why bother?

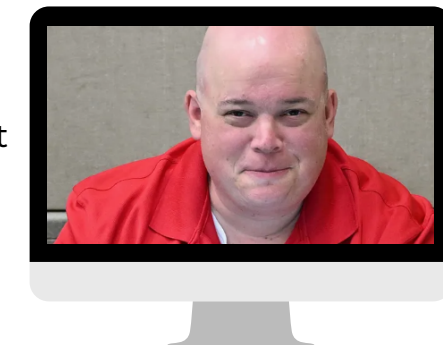
- Saves time – No more endless scrolling
- Helps avoid mistakes – You don't accidentally miss stuff
- Makes big files less annoying – Super useful for long or complicated stuff

So next time you're hunting for some info in a never-ending email chain or trying to spot that one number in a spreadsheet, just remember this handy shortcut. It's the easiest way to zip through your work way faster—no tech skills needed.

250TH ANNIVERSARY EDITION PART 1



2026 is here and we will be celebrating our 250 th Anniversary this coming July. This brings me back to the last big celebration we had which was in 1976 (Our 200th Anniversary). I remember it very well as this was also my first year of pitching in the NHPA. As a young 12-year-old, I went to tournaments every weekend with my father, brother and neighbor all throughout Missouri and Kansas. Places like St. Joseph, Atchison, Leavenworth and Topeka. I remember vividly that there was a tournament on the 4 th of July in Mound City, Missouri and I painted my horseshoes red, white and blue like the flag. That was 50 years ago and how times have changed, even in our sport. Let's just look back at what the World Tournament looked like back then in Part I of the 250 th Anniversary Edition.

The 1976 World Tournament was held in Levittown, Pennsylvania, it spans several townships, with a significant portion located in Bristol Township, creating a close relationship with the surrounding historical area. After the 36-Man Round Robin a best 2 out of 3 playoff was needed to crown the Men's World Champion. Carl Steinfeldt from New York and Curt Day from Indiana as both were tied with records of 33-2. Carl was victorious winning his only Men's World Title defeating Curt in the playoffs with a record of 2-1. Pitching 2,665 ringers out of 3,220 shoes for an 82.76%. Curt would finish with a better overall ringer percentage while pitching 2,586 ringers out of 3,072 shoes for an 84.18%. Four other men would finish with averages over 80%

3 rd Place – Mark Seibold – Indiana 31-4 2,474 / 2,914 84.90%
4 th Place – Elmer Hohl – Canada 29-6 2,507 / 3,014 83.18%
5 th Place – Glen “Red” Henton – Iowa 29-6 2,571 / 3,132 82.09%
7 th Place – Bob West – Oregon 25-10 2,400 / 2,986 80.38%

The NHPA Hall of Fame was only into its eleventh year of existence with four individuals being inducted that year.

I hope everyone is getting entered and excited to come see what a great tournament this will be. We also had our January meeting to keep this great organization moving forward and growing.

I let the council know that I am running for Sec/Treasurer again and hope I can serve you for another 3 years. It has been a pleasure to be on the NHPA Council and organize the World Tournament each year with the great council members I get to work with. If there is anything that I can help you with, please give me a call.

I would like everyone that has entered the World Tournament to go verify your entry in eShoe and check that you are in the correct Division. It is still early and you have until May 18th to get entered, but the sooner the better. To verify your entry go to NHPA-eshoe.com. When the page opens you will see "Featured and Favorite Events" in a blue banner. Click on the banner. A list of tournaments will appear, find 2026 WT Prelims and click the blue icon on the left. A new page will open with 4 blue buttons. Click on "View Entries" and use the boxes listed to sort entries and find your name and Division. If it is correct then all is well, but if you are not in the correct Division call me and let's get it fixed. It is harder to fix and move pitchers around once the schedule is created. We are on a good pace to hit 1000 pitchers for this tournament.

Also please verify that you have updated your membership in eShoe and are current for 2026. You can contact your Charter sec/treasurer and they can help you or give me a call.

You need 4 tournaments to qualify for the World Tournament from May 2025 to May 18, 2026. You can view this in eShoe by entering your name in the search box. Type your name and a list will appear that is a match of what you have typed in the search box. Find your name and click on it. At the bottom of the box that opens it will show you your total tournaments from the past 12 months. You can click on "Details" and a list of your tournaments will appear.

Keep looking for ways to share this great sport with everyone you come in contact with so we can get our membership back to over 10,000 members! See you on the Courts.

All Entries must be on this signed form and mailed with a postmark no later than May 18, 2026. You may enter anytime prior to May 18, 2026 using this form or on our website link. Entries received with a postmark after May 18, 2026 shall be put on a waiting list and entered into the World Tournament only as spaces are available. All Adults must have pitched in a minimum of four (4) US/Canadian sanctioned events in the twelve (12) months prior to May 18, 2026 in the same division you are entering. Only one (1) event is required for Juniors/Cadets. Exceptions for US Armed Forces members and family and Foreign competitors (other than Canadians) are outlined in Rule 11, Sec D.1 of the RGS Book. Contact NHPA for more information regarding qualifying exceptions. All Averages used will be the average on record in NHPA-eShoe as of May 18, 2026. Anyone qualifying under an exception must have those scores recorded by the same date. All NHPA and any special tournament rules apply. Please see note regarding refunds.

READ CAREFULLY: Any Adult male pitching from the full distance platform may enter the OPEN Men's Division regardless of age, just as any Adult Female may enter the OPEN Women's Division. To enter the Senior Division, you must be 60 years of age or older before the end of 2026. Any Man/Women that turns 65 years of age in 2026, or has an approved Medical exemption may enter the Elders Division. Entrants in the Jr Boys and Jr Girls Division eighteen (18) years old or younger for the entire calendar year OR through September 30th of the year of completing high School - not to exceed 19 years of age. Cadet Boys & Cadet Girls Division entrants must be 12 years old or younger for the entire 2026 calendar year.

NOTE #1: 30 ft Men with a Medical Exemption must be in NHPA eShoe as "Exempt" to pitch in this Division. A copy of the Exemption Form must be sent with this application.
NOTE #2: For Prelim Class play, a minimum of 48 pitchers must enter Sr Division's or it may be canceled. All entrants will then pitch in the Open Division if canceled.
NOTE #3: Junior Boys & Junior Girls Divisions will be mixed for preliminary class play. Cadet Boys & Cadet Girls Divisions will be mixed for preliminary class play.

The pitching schedule will be finalized by May 31, 2026 and published on the NHPA website www.horseshoepitching.com. If you indicate above to receive the schedule by mail, it will be mailed to the address you have listed above during the 2nd week in June. Please write address clearly & readable.

Please note: The NHPA reserves the right to disallow your participation for any of the following reasons: Any errors on this form, if your records don't appear in NHPA eShoe or any false or misleading information on this form, cannot validate Medical Exemption, or for any other reason by majority vote of the NHPA Council. The NHPA also reserves the right to add qualified entrants and to make class participant changes after the above deadline. No pitcher will be moved from a class or pitching time, without notification, after the final schedule has been published.
